In the World

1853-1856 - Crimean War.

1861/04/12 to 1865/05/26 - American Civil War.

1870-71 - Franco Prussian War led to German unification.



In Canada

1851 – **Commons Schools Act** led to local schooling throughout Ontario.

1863 – **Scott Act** extends Roman Catholic schooling in rural Ontario.

1864/09/01 to 1864/09/09 – **Charlottetown Conference** when Canadian Confederation was being discussed.

1865/10/10 to 1865/10/24 - Quebec Conference to discuss Confederation.

1866-71 – **Fenian Raids** from the United States.

1866/12 to 1867/03 – London Conference finalizes the details of the British North America Act in London England.

1867/07/01 - Canadian Confederation. Canada West becomes Ontario, Canada East becomes Quebec.

1869-1870 – **Red River Resistance** led to the founding of Manitoba on 1870/07/15.

1870/07/15 – **Rupert's Land** joins Confederation.

1871/07/20 - British Columbia joins Confederation.

1873/05/23 – North-West Mounted Police founded.

1873/07/01 – **Prince Edward Island** joins Confederation.

In Ottawa

1850/01/01 – **Bytown** is incorporated.

1855/01/01 – Bytown is renamed **Ottawa.**

1857 – Ottawa is named Capital of Canada by Queen Victoria.

1860, September 1 – Cornerstone of the Parliament Buildings laid by the Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII.

1874 - Bank of Ottawa established.

In Gloucester

1850/01/01 – Gloucester Township is established as a separate municipality. James Sieveright is elected first Reeve.

1850 - Delorme Post Office opens. It is renamed Lourdes on 1875/08/01 and Cyrville on 1892/04/01.

1854/12/25 – First train runs on **Bytown and Prescott Railway.**

1858/04/05 – William Upton, a participant of the Crimean War, purchases land that later becomes the Ottawa Hunt Club.

1858/09/09 - St. Joseph becomes Gloucester's first subdivision, now Orléans.

1860 - Green Shoal Light built on Ottawa River, later becomes the beacon referred to by Beacon Hill.

1863/10/06 – First **Gloucester Agricultural Fair** at Billings Bridge.

1864/04/05 – **Braddish Billings** dies.

1864/10/25 – Village of Cathartic(k) registered, now known as Carlsbad Springs.

1865 - Rideau Hall leased as the Governor General's residence. It was purchased on 1868/07/28.

1866 – Village of **New Edinburgh** incorporated.

1866/12/12 – Michael & Joseph Cyr subdivide **'Cyrville'** for market gardeners.

1868 – **24 Sussex Drive** is built by Joseph Merrill Currier.

1870/08/17 – **Great Fire of Carleton County** is known as the **10 Mile Fire** in Gloucester.

1871 – **Notre Dame Cemetery** opens on Montreal Road.

1873/10/25 – **Beechwood Cemetery** consecrated.

1874 – **New Township Hall** built at Billings Bridge.

First township meeting is held on 1875/06/07.
