



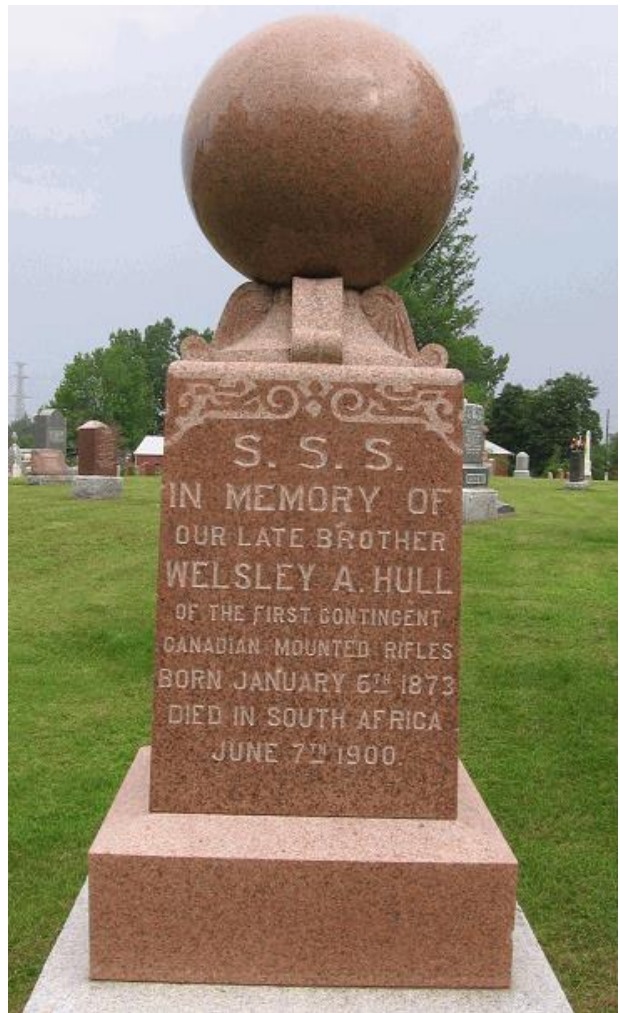
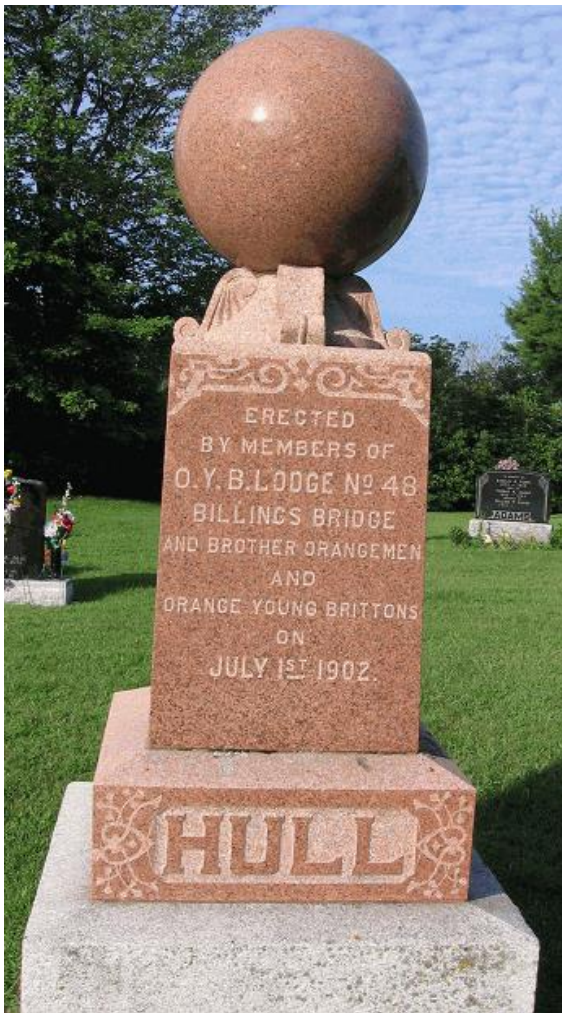
***The Eastview Cenotaph, 180 Marier Avenue.***

Died on April 22, 1945 in the Netherlands***

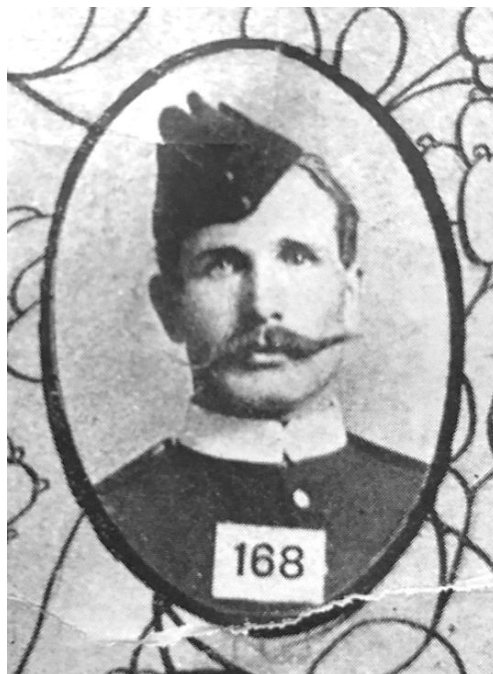


***Private Bernard Joseph Fairfield, Eastview

*St. George's Hawthorne Cemetery, Russell Road (originally at Billings Bridge)  
Commemorates Gloucester's only Boer War Casualty*

*Canadian Mounted Rifle, Boer War*  
*Died on June 6, 1900 in South Africa*



**Lieutenant Herbert Stopford Maunsell, Rockcliffe**  
*2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of the  
Royal Warwickshire Regiment, WW I  
He died in France on September 1, 1915*



**Captain Harold Wilson Barrett, Leitrim**  
*Royal Canadian Artillery, WW II*



**Flying Officer Harold Alexander Armstrong, Edwards**  
*RCAF in World War II  
He died during air operations on October 25, 1944*



**Gaston Cousineau, Orléans**  
*World War II  
He was later an Oblate Father of Mary  
Immaculate.*



**Pilot Officer Lloyd John Innes, Cyrville**  
RCAF in World War II  
Died during air operations on October 23, 1944



**Sapper Walter Howard Weatherall, Eastview**  
Royal Canadian Engineers in WWII  
Died in France on August 10, 1944



**Flight Sergeant Jean Albert Marc Turner,**  
Hurdman's Bridge  
103 RAF Squadron in World War II  
Died in air operation on June 9, 1942  
during the Battle of Dieppe



**Private John Tuckey, Ramsayville**  
Royal Canadian Infantry Corps in WWII  
Died in military service on April 15, 1945



**Constable David Latimer Cowan, Leitrim**  
*Died on April 14, 1885, Fort Pitt, Sask.  
1885 Northwest Rebellion*



**Trooper Francis John Duncan Greene, Leitrim**  
*Canadian Army in WWII*



**Private Cecil Arthur Gladman, Eastview**  
*Railway Construction & Forestry Depot  
In World War I*



**Corporal Andrew Barton Hellard, Eastview**  
*RCAF during WWII  
Died in service in Greenwood, NS on August 5, 1945*

*Billings Bridge*

*Royal Canadian Mechanical and Electrical Engineers, WWII*  
*Died while in service on November 7, 1945*

*South Gloucester*

*Queen's Own Rifle of Canada, WWII*  
*Died in Caen, France on July 5, 1944*

Died in France on March 1, 1917

**Lance Corporal Lucien Decarie,** *Eastview*

*Died in a plane crash at Rockcliffe on May 15, 1943*

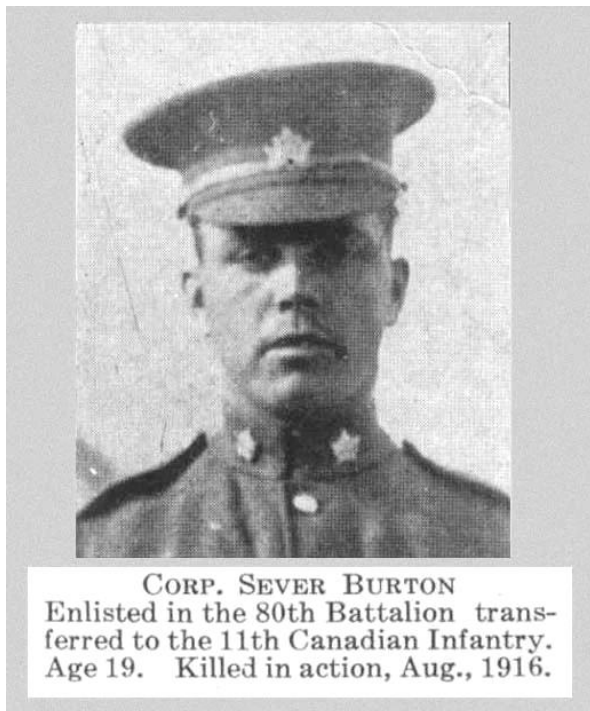




**Rifleman Roger Joseph Monette, Eastview** *Pilot Officer John 'Donald' MacLeod, Overbrook*
