The Ontario Liquor Control Act was enacted in 1927 ending Prohibition in Ontario however, plebiscites were also required in each municipality to allow the public sale of liquor. This did not occur in Gloucester until June 28, 1967.

3 Walkley Road is the division line between the Rideau Front and Junction Gore survey areas

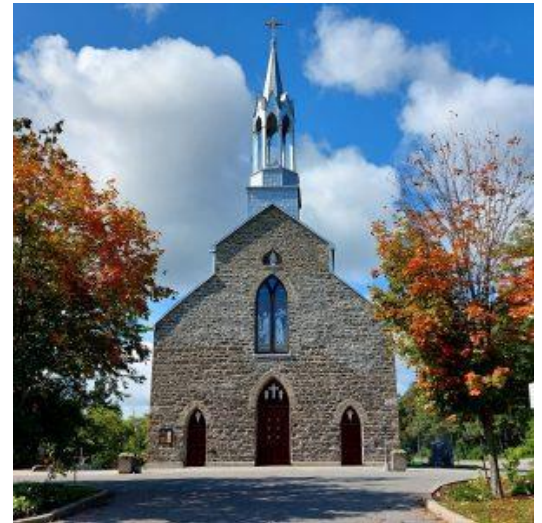
